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






- ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT- Erin Dietsche -

Erin Dietsche (She/Her) is a playwright, born and raised in the Midwest, who currently resides in the desert of Tucson, Arizona. Her plays have been featured at the University of Iowa and as part of the 2014 New South Young Playwrights Contest & Festival at Horizon Theatre in Atlanta. Her script *Replay* was part of Civic Theatre of Greater Lafayette's 2018 10-Minute Play Festival and was picked as a Midwest finalist for the 2019 Minnesota Shorts Play Festival. Additionally, *Hexakosioihexekontahexaphobia* was selected for Civic's 2019 10-Minute Play Festival.

- PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES -

The seed for this play emerged in my head years ago, but it took some time for me to configure the inner workings of the story and help it take root.

Once it did, I was tasked with confronting numerous questions, from the logistical to the moral: How much time needs to elapse between scenes? Which scenes need to come before others? What would someone do in a situation like this? What would be their fears, their vulnerabilities, and their goals? Why would someone do something even if it's wrong? What makes someone stand up for what's right?

My goal with *Chill* is to examine these questions along with multiple others. While many of them do not have a concrete answer, they are well worth contemplating and seeking to understand, especially in the world we live in today.

This workshop with Winding Road has allowed me to thoroughly flesh out more of the characters and revise the play's ending. Additionally, it has been a chance to participate in my favorite aspect of theatre: collaboration.

Talking through scenes, motivations, and character development with other people has helped immensely. Without the collaborative aspect of this workshop, *Chill* would not be where it is today.

- DIRECTOR'S NOTES -

I have spent half of my career working on classical plays and half of it on brand new plays. I feel the former strongly supports the latter! It is always so exciting to be a birthing coach to a new work. Erin Dietsche is definitely doing the real labor, as the rest of us support this creation.

For me, a workshop and staged reading of a brand-new script is all about the playwright and the story she/he feels called to tell. Working hand in hand with the playwright, as we are fortunate to be able to do with Erin, is intimate and collaborative, as theatre should be.

Erin is telling an important story so my desire is to support her and it with everything we do, from auditions through workshops to the live readings. It is not an easy chronicle, therefore, focusing on the text and vision of the playwright is crucial. It is an emotionally disturbing tale, one that we can only hope moves the audience, not so much to feel but to change, therefore, staying true to the text is the key to moving the audience.

Thank you for being witness to this new play and its process. Without you, it would be as if a painting was created and then hung in a closet without ever being seen. YOU are the next step in the development of Erin's challenging play.
