




#### - ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT- Adrienne Earle Pender -

Adrienne Earle Pender began her writing career in 2001. Her first play, The Rocker, was a finalist in the Dayton Playhouse Future Fest 2002 Festival of New Works in Dayton, Ohio. The Rocker made its world premiere in February 2004 at Theater in the Park in Raleigh, North Carolina. Her play, Stone Face was a selection in the Reader's Theater at the 2003 National Black Theater Festival, and was an alternate selection for the 2004 Edward Albee 12th Annual Last Frontier Theatre Conference in Valdez, Alaska. Her short play, The Murder of Love was selected for the Short Play Lab at the same conference. Additionally, Banana Split Lady made its debut at the 1st Annual Great Plains Theatre Conference in Nebraska. Her play, Somewhere In Between, had a staged reading at the Drama Book Shop in New York in 2010; a staged reading at Wordsmyth Theater in Houston, TX in May, 2014; and Somewhere In Between received a full production from Theater in the Park in Raleigh in September 2014.

Her most recent play, "N," about African-American actor Charles S. Gilpin, was a finalist in the Dayton Playhouse 2016 Future Fest competition. "N" received a workshop and a staged reading at the Eugene O'Neill Festival in Danville, CA in September 2016, and made its world premiere in February 2017 at Theatre in the Park in Raleigh, NC.

Adrienne received a Tao House Fellowship by the Eugene O'Neill Foundation in September 2015. She holds an MFA in Creative Writing from Wilkes University, and is a member of the Dramatist Guild.

#### - DRAMATURG'S NOTES -

By 1920 America had been through a great deal, people were recovering from a two year long flu pandemic and from the end of World War I. Violence against Black people had been increasing, leading to The Red Summer in 1919 during which riots broke out in cities across the country killing hundreds. At the same time, The Harlem Renaissance was in full swing and Black culture was teeming with excellence. New York City was starting to look like how we think of it today, skyscrapers were being built and the subway system being heavily invested in. The American audiences of 1920 hadn't seen anything like *The* Emperor Jones. Eugene O'Neill's first foray into expressionist theater abstracted the feelings and fears of its title character into dreamlike scenes onstage. The bulk of the scenes were done as monologues performed as the emperor fled the position he obtained via trickery into the jungle, pursued by a quickening heartbeat of tom-toms while he encounters ghost-like shades. O'Neill wrote this play in response to reading news stories of the US Navy occupation of Haiti, which was going through violent revolts. The role of the emperor was the role of a lifetime. Charles S. Gilpin was cast. "He was limited not by his own range as an actor, but by the limitations of the part the Negro could play in the theatre," said Moss Hart, who played Smithers in 1926 opposite Gilpin. This was mostly true, though he would be limited in his career by two other things. The first, his love for alcohol, a trait he shared with O'Neill, that was not at all tempered by Prohibition laws. The second, was Gilpin's refusal to stay faithful to O'Neill's text, which included 35 instances of the N-word in its 80 minute runtime. Neither man was merely being obstinate for the sake of it, both held strong convictions rooted in years of theatrical study that lead them to different artistic views on the play. O'Neill just happened to be the one in a position to fire Gilpin.

His most recent dramatic stage appearances were at The Community Playhouse in *Rabbit Hole* (Howie), at Winding Road in *The Little Foxes* (Horace), and in Winding Road's staged reading of *The Wrong People Have Money* (Col. Threlfall/Rev. Landow), as part of its Winding Reads series.



**Tanisha Ray (Florence Gilpin)** is a published author and licensed counselor, new to the craft of acting. Her theatrical debut was with Winding Road Theater, and she's honored to be in the compelling stage reading,  $\mathcal{N}$ . She has previously acted in productions about social justice, advocacy, and mental health which include the staged reading, A Shot Away, and short films such as  $Mirror\ Mirror\ Precious\ Perfect\ Roomies\ and the award-winning short film, <math>Yellow\ Rose$ .

#### **Alex Totillo (Production Manager/Dramaturg)**



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
